What is the Legacy Circle?

The Legacy Circle honors individuals and families who have demonstrated their extraordinary commitment to the mission of the **Frank Lloyd Wright Building Conservancy** and its future through the establishment of a bequest, trust or other planned giving arrangement to benefit the Conservancy, or who have made a very significant gift to establish a specialized ongoing fund.

Why should you join?

When you become a member of the Legacy Circle you will know that you are helping safeguard Frank Lloyd Wright's architecture for future generations. Such gifts help to fortify our financial base, which translates into an enhanced ability to preserve the built work of Frank Lloyd Wright through advocacy, education and access to technical information and services. Your estate planning can mean so much!

How to include the Conservancy in your estate plans.

By making a provision in your estate plans to benefit the Conservancy you become a member of the Legacy Circle. We need only a confirmation in writing that you have made such arrangements and your permission to list your name* as a member of the Legacy Circle. An estate gift arrangement can be a simple bequest or some other type of planned gift that is part of your estate. A bequest can be a specific amount or a percentage – whatever fits your intentions and preferences. These gifts are generally placed into our Legacy Fund, which functions as a quasi-endowment.

Sample wording for a bequest: *I give and devise to the Frank Lloyd Wright Building Conservancy, located in Chicago, IL USA, the sum of \$xxx [or specific asset or % of the estate] to be used for its general support.*

The Conservancy is an Illinois not-for-profit charitable tax-exempt organization, a 501(c)(3) organization per the US Internal Revenue Service tax code.
